Minutes of the September 15th Meeting

Corrections were made to the May minutes as follows- Sylvia Swift has been a member for 18 years, not 5 as was reported in the minutes. The May minutes were accepted with the noted correction.

Linda Uballe gave the treasurer's report. As of July 2011, the balance on hand was \$2867.20, less the book auction \$1360.00. Deposits totaled \$1028.05, for a total of \$3895.24. Disbursements totaled \$1467.00. Balance on hand is \$2428.25. Other information on the CD's was MB CD is \$9849.78 and the EJH fund has \$5756.97.

Brandey Addison reported no new correspondence.

New Business

Dues are due by October 20 so our treasurer, Linda, will be able to get her report in to Alpha State on time.

The Budget Report was given by Beverly Tackett. The July, 2011 balance was \$2867.20 less \$1360.00 for the book auction. Leaving a balance of \$1507.20. Estimated income was made totaling \$3567.00. Estimated state and international expenses sub-totaled \$2621.20. Estimated Chapter expenses were a sub-total of \$1175.00. Total expenses were \$3796.20. Estimated balance for July 1, 2012 is \$1278.00. The finance committee made a recommendation to transfer \$600.00 to the Ester J. Hahn fund. It was noted that the chapter buys pins for members with 25 years. Elnora Corbin will be given a 50year pin and the chapter will be paying her dues. Also add money to the scholarship fund and give two scholarships, if our balance is still good. The budget was accepted.

There was a discussion of places to have this year's initiation on November 5. We are in charge. Several places will be contacted about date and cost.

Shayla Floyd passed out a list of committees and their chairpersons.
