## Minutes of the September Meeting

9/17/2015

President Shannon Clubb called the meeting to order at 5:50 p.m. with thanks and a report on the State Convention. In order to attend her daughter's choir concert, Shannon then turned the meeting over to Vice President Brandey Addison.

In attendance were Brandey Addison, Kimberly Brumley, Shannon Clubb, Kimberly Craig, Janice Doughty, Ann Falkner, Neva Gentry, Sylvia Gonzalez, Roxanna Guerrero, Norma Janice, Brenda Machen, Libby McGee, Bettie Mitchell, Sharon Phillips, Donna Rodenberg, Angela Steagall, Beverly Tackett, and Debbie VanZandt

The May minutes were approved as printed in the last newsletter. There was no correspondence, but Libby McGee reported on the condition of former treasurer Linda Uballe after breaking her knee. Libby suggested that Theta Gamma members help Linda out with rides to therapy and will get a list of dates to anyone who is interested.

Kimberly Brumley presented the treasurer's report. Beginning balance is \$1271.82. Deposits of \$2800.03 and disbursements of \$1138.82 give a closing balance of \$2933.03. Included in the deposits is a check from ASTEF for Teen Bookfest by the Bay which will be turned over soon. A discrepancy of \$87.96, in our favor, between the bank reported

balance (\$1271.82) and the treasurer's reported balance (\$1184.36) will be researched and corrected. The treasurer's report was approved and filed for audit.

Norma Janice presented the budget proposal for 2015-2016. The balance forward from July 1, 2015 was \$433.03. Estimated income from dues and fundraisers amounted to \$2780. Estimated expense for state and International dues is \$1881.00, and chapter expenses are estimated at \$1225, giving an ending balance of \$107.03. Members were reminded that this budget does not include any amounts for scholarships. Libby McGee moved to accept the budget and it was approved unanimously.

No bylaw changes were discussed.

Membership recommendations were as follows:

Donna Rodenberg presented 3 candidates, Barbara MacDonald from the Diocese of Corpus Christi, and Mairaed Gillooly and Samantha Greses from Ss. Cyril and Methodius Catholic School. Donna also recommended one reinstatement, Valarie Buhidar.

Kimberly Brumley presented two candidates, Debrena Lightfoot and Kelli Powell, both from CCISD.

A vote was taken. All new candidates were approved for membership, and the reinstatement was approved.

Committees were allowed time to work and plan using the program planner.

A cup was passed for PACE donation benefitting the International Speakers Fund. The amount donated was \$17.39.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:00 p.m.

## Don't Pass These Up

Our Esther Jane Roark Hahn Scholarship is open to a resident of the Coastal Bend pursuing a career in the field of education. The grant is for \$300.00 and may be used for tuition, registration fees, books or supplies. The applicant may be enrolled in any level of education with the transcript reflecting an

overall average of at least 2.0. Preference is given to relatives of Theta Gamma members.

Do you have a student or a family member that meets these qualifications? If so, please remember the application is due to the Scholarship Committee **before April 1**.

As a member of Theta Gamma you are eligible to apply for the May Blythe Theta Gamma Scholarship. You must have been a member of Theta Gamma for at least one year. The scholarship is for \$300.00 and may be used for tuition, fees, books or supplies at a non-society continuing professional education event, seminar, workshop, or graduate class.

Remember the scholarship does not have to be used for a formal classroom setting course. Some of you may be passing up free money. The application is due to the Scholarship Committee before April 1.
