The treasurer's report was given by Linda Uballe. The March ending balance was \$775.57. Two deposits were made-raffle basket, \$70.00 and the pick up the Pace Pig, \$16.32, for a total of \$86.32. Available funds were \$861.87. Disbursements were \$42.86 to Carol Walker for communication reimbursements. The balance on hand is \$819.03.

Kay Schroeder had a thank you card for us to sign to Kacie Sicilia for letting us have our meeting at the Holiday Inn. The meeting room and the buffet were wonderful.

New business

The Area V convention wants a donation to make a raffle basket. We voted to send \$10.00. Theo Wagner gave an update from the legislature, discussed identity theft, and supplemental funds for retirees. HB 3353 has to do with a retiree being rehired after one year. HB 2506 defined security and is not good for Texas. Another HB deals with stopping teachers from taking their retirement as a lump sum.

Leslie Jo Elmore gave an update on the upcoming book auction. We have 2 banners with no date so they can be reused. These banners will be placed on the lawn of Driscoll Children's Hospital. Kimberly Brumley will be on Channel 3's Early Morning Show on May 9. Leslie Jo Elmore will be on Channel 6 at noon on May13. We will be working on the history of Theta Gamma during the summer and will have a report ready for the first meeting in September. Debbie VanZandt who was selected to serve on the Spirit of Texas committee for the Young Adult Round Table of the Texas Library Association. This committee will promote books created by Texas authors and illustrators for youths in grades 9-12 by developing a recommended reading list to encourage youths in grades 9-12 to explore a variety of current, quality books from Texas authors and illustrators, develop critical reading skills, and to encourage greater interaction between Texas authors and illustrators, Texas librarians, and Texas youth. The Spirit of Texas Reading Program-High School is intended for recreational reading, not to support a specific curriculum. This is a brand new committee for YART

Kimberly Brumley who has been promoted to the position of Director of Professional Learning as part of Superintendent Scott Elliff's reorganization of the Office of Curriculum and Instruction. Her responsibilities center on the design, delivery, and assessment of engaging instruction, and her staff includes 16 of the District's instructional coaches. The 150 kids from her area that were helped to get ready for school were part of the city-wide program that gave away 5,000 backpacks.
